We dropped off 46 meals (hot and cold) of variety. We delivered soups, salads, yogurts, bread, water, eatery, and pastries to [Fathers and Blessings](#) (FAB) house, 5500 and Wentworth, 5614 South Green. FAB serves as a haven and home for veterans and non-violent offenders, seeking to overcome various challenges. On 5500 Wentworth, right off the expressway, we serviced four (4) homeless people. We gave them sandwiches, side salads, and water. We dropped the remaining box of food to a disabled veteran on 56th and Green.

We approximately fed 23 people twice a day. What a magical experience!
